When the students on FRC Team 980 think of a hero, we think of our mentor Dr. David Brinza. His success can be measured by the lives he has changed as a mentor and dedicated FIRST volunteer for the past decade.

Brinza started mentoring Team 980 "Thunderbots" in 2003 becoming lead mentor in 2007. He has a strong influence on students, teaching problem solving skills, creativity, and persistence.
